THE SPATIAL TURN

- Turns:
 - 1960s: Quantitative
 - 1980s: Linguistic & Cultural
 - 2000s: Emotive; Memory; Spatial?
- Space can be a causal factor
 - History within units of space?
 - Spaces themselves have agency?



THE SPATIAL TURN?

Jo Gaudi:

- For the broader questions of landscape-worldview, palimpsest, the commons and community, panopticism and territoriality--are older than GIS, their stories rooted in the foundations of the modern disciplines
- Modern history started with a landscape. Jules Michelet, Thomas Babington Macaulay, and Ranke forged experiments in applying the critical history of princes to the space of a nation.




SPACE & PLACE

- Space as metaphor gendered space etc
- Lefebvre \ Soja \ Knott (etc.):
 - Spaces = physical
 - Places = experienced
- Spaces no longer purely passive
 - Dynamic, relational, agentive
- But how to observe\measure without implication of determinism?




SPATIAL HUMANITIES

- Applied spatial turn?
- Beyond space as metaphor
 - Boundaries, networks, interactions (not just places)
- 'GIS lies at the heart of this so called spatial turn'







FUNDAMENTALS OF GIS




- Cartesian coordinates
 - Implied precision
- Structured data
 - Implied precision



HUMANITIES GIS CHALLENGES

- Epistemology of geographic knowledge
 - Positivist \ conditional?
- Implied precision
 - Precision ≠ Accuracy
 - Fuzzy data?
 - Incomplete data
 - Unknowable samples
 - 'Modifiable Area Unit Problem'





OBJECTS, 'FIELDS', ONTOLOGIES

- GIS tends to privilege discrete objects
 - Continuous 'fields' best represented by rasters
- Is a town an object?
 - How useful is a centroid point?
 - Does an administrative boundary accurately define?
 - Reality a bit fuzzy?
- (Primitive) tabular database structure
 - Demands defined ontology
 - Humanists value variance, GIS demands standardisation



HISTORICAL CHALLENGES

Theoretical:


- GIS Privileges quantitative data
 - How to reconcile 'fuzzy' qualitative data?
 - How far to standardise irregular data?

Practical:

- Availability\suitability of gazetteers
- Availability\suitability of basemaps











DEEDS TO MAPS



Map Revision: 12/08/2009







MAPPING JURISDICTIONS








ARCHDEACONRY LEVEL PROBATE JURISDICTIONS




CONSISTORY LEVEL PROBATE






MULTIMEDIA MAPPING


